There is a 27% increase in the number of schools reached in the first year with a 44% increase in the number of students screened. Two new volunteer coordinators were brought in to help recruit new dentists. • Added dental initiative Oral Health for Older Adults. Worked on by Oral Health Kansas. • Training JCCC staff and students on oral health and nutrition. |
| | <p>Mental Health and Substance Abuse</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mental Health First Aid taught nine classes in 2013. Blue Valley and SMSD are interested in hosting the youth class. Olathe school district is planning on putting their entire staff through the youth program. (Principals, teachers, food service and janitorial staff) • Promoting awareness through six different National Awareness days per year. • Working on revised parent info forms and encouraging parents to share pertinent info with providers who are working with children who have been released from psychiatric settings. |
