Review of Community Health Improvement Plan Activities/Accomplishments	<p>Physical Activity</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Overland Park is working on a plan for bicycle paths. As well as participating in Complete Streets, Brentwood has received a grant for trails that will benefit the school as well as the community. A survey will be sent out to the schools in order to gain feedback to help with the planning for next year. <p>Nutrition</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Kansas Health Foundation has released the new nutritional standards. Concession stands will offer a pre-order options for coaches. Working on an informative video on the SCORE campaign. SCORE working on parental awareness through a photo campaign. JCDHE is working with American Heart on a program called A Healthy Way to Grow. The program will work with 30 day care centers to evaluate healthy foods and physical activity. <p>Access to Care</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Focus on adult oral health initiative. Project "Lifetime Smiles" is working on advocacy by raising awareness through published articles and a poster campaign. Looking to have extractions and fillings performed by hygienists. Can provide exams, x-rays and cleanings twice per year. JCCC is hosting an event for oral health professionals on June 6th to focus on periodontal disease in association with diabetes and stroke. In children's oral health thousands of children have been treated, with 36% being uninsured. School screenings are going well but some schools decline as there is no consequence. There are three options for dental screenings that are offered to the schools and it is decided by the school nurse at what level they wish to participate: Basic screening, Basic screening plus fluoride or Comprehensive treatment. Always looking for new hygienists to volunteer. The availability of My Resource Connection has expanded to include nine locations. JCDHE has a new brochure with a more detailed description of its services.

	<p>Mental Health</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Received KS Department of Aging grant and there are four initiatives that will be worked on: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Families and Schools Together, (FAST) – A training will be completed by 6/30 to implement into one elementary school in the fall. 2. Monthly Health Awareness Days – will be sent out to partners and posted on their websites. 3. Mental Health First Aid – has been a focus and Shawnee Mission School District had 90 individuals complete the training, Nieman Elementary had an all staff training and SMSD has received a grant from KS Health Foundation to sponsor a train the trainer and they hope to be able to open the class to all staff and has made a webpage containing all of the information on the class. JCDHE is offering the program at their Annual School Nurse Workshop on 6/6. The training is also offered to the public June 3, 4, 10, and 11. 4. Pilot program in the middle schools based on Café Conversations. There is a parent session that covers brain development, the effects of alcohol and substance abuse, and family expectations. The kids portion would be activity based and focus on decision making and beginning family conversations. There are currently 130 registrants.

Collect information on the outcome of work that has been completed so far. • Look at trends. What is emerging? • Look at Healthy People 2012 on a Johnson County level. Look at 10 initiatives instead of the entire document. • Work with the hospital on a joint assessment that would be done every three years, next assessment in 2016? • Look at the coalition, see who is at the table and who needs to be. Is everyone represented? Nurses Association? • Continue meeting and working to strengthen our relationships to achieve better outcomes. • Targeted focus groups. • Showcase what each entity has to offer and how we can help and collaborate. • Send a survey or come up with an activity to focus on who we are missing, who has stopped participating and why, is there an alternate contact that we have not connected with? • Kevin Kovach will begin working on data collection to present at the next meeting.
