<b>Physical Activity Nutrition Update</b>	<p>Nutrition - Food Policy</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•Contracted with KU to change the food policy model to make it more grass roots.</li> <li>•Looking at fresh fruits and vegetables and making them more accessible.</li> <li>•Childcare center classes about healthy nutrition policies are going well.</li> <li>•JCDHE is working on procurement plan to implement healthy food buying practices.</li> <li>•WIC Community Garden is going great.</li> </ul> <p>Physical Activity</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•Walk KS is the largest participant group in KS. This year's Walk Kansas was very successful.</li> <li>•Eleven communities attended Walk Friendly workshop training. Grandview and Lees Summit are implementing the plan.</li> <li>•New bike plans have been adopted by Leawood and Overland Park.</li> <li>•New bike lanes are in place and more planned. Would like to look at walking trails next.</li> <li>•Mid America Regional Council working on planning.</li> </ul>
<b>Access to Care</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Reaching out to municipalities as well as health facilities to market MyRC.</li> <li>• Dental initiative - plan sending letters to remind school nurses of the importance of the in-school dental screening. Health Partnership went to 14 Olathe schools and had 750 students signed up for screenings with x-rays and dental work provided when necessary.</li> <li>• Action plan put together for the next steps.</li> <li>• Johnson County Commission on Aging joining forces with Friends of Senior Kansans Inc. They have received an approved 501(c)(3). Putting together oral health kits that are being distributed thorough meals on wheels. Developing a group to look at how to improve coverage of oral health services provided to seniors. Suggested several groups to contact.</li> </ul>

<b>Mental Health Substance Abuse</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•Media campaign focusing on middle school parents and underage drinking and talking to your kids.</li> <li>•Partnering with Shawnee. Had banners at the pools.</li> <li>•Advertising at community events, City Hall, Justice Center, faith communities.</li> <li>•Attending farmers markets to distribute reusable grocery bags that are printed with the conversation starter materials to the community. One side is English and one side Spanish.</li> <li>•Trying to utilize school nurses for materials distribution also.</li> <li>•Partnering with Human Services to reach JoCo food pantry clients.</li> <li>•Small posters are available for community bulletin boards. Libraries, grocery stores, Starbucks, etc...</li> <li>•Using digital marketing with the help of a media company.</li> <li>•Takeover Day-once a month. Where the ad gets viewed across the bottom of the screen at KMBZ.</li> <li>•Working on grant for the next fiscal year to maintain programs.</li> <li>•JCDHE has offered some staff time and resources available to work on tobacco prevention if anyone needs extra hands in this area.</li> </ul>
<b>Next Community Health Assessment</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•JCDHE partnered with Olathe Medical Center, Children’s Mercy, St. Luke’s, Shawnee Mission Medical Center to do the community health needs assessment.</li> <li>•Have been looking at the best way to go about information gathering from the community.</li> <li>•Survey will work to hit all populations and ages.</li> </ul> <p>Elizabeth Lawlor, Epidemiologist, JCDHE - CASPER Presentation, Community Health Assessment for Public Health Emergency Response</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•Comes from a North Carolina model and collection will be done through an app allowing information to be recorded on tablets, eliminating the need for data entry.</li> <li>•Teams will go out with each team will visiting seven households to ask the survey questions personally, for a total of 210 surveys.</li> <li>•Locations are picked randomly.</li> <li>•Questionnaire is being developed by JCDHE and the hospitals involved to find the community’s opinion of the health needs in Johnson County.</li> <li>•Goal is to launch by early October. Best days to conduct have been found to be Thursday through Saturday.</li> <li>•Will also do a survey focused on the biggest areas of poverty</li> </ul>
<b>Updates and Sharing</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Health Partnership starting a program to give free blood pressures and supply clients with log sheets.</li> <li>•Passed out new Johnson County Health Profile .</li> <li>•Opening a new birth center at Mercy and Truth and have hired a new physician.</li> <li>•RPC has a name change to Prevention Services with the Johnson County Health Center.</li> <li>•CAVU Health Systems does mobile data and mobile billing at their sites. Consult and manage health fairs. Planning a back to school event. Giving out dental kits and backpacks. Sponsoring a walk in the Plaza. Indie Fit resource coming out.</li> <li>•Working with seniors who have chronic diseases using the Minute Movement program.</li> <li>•Two MHFA trainings coming up. Youth-for Spring Hill, adult - Overland Park at the Justice Center.</li> </ul>
