(JOHNSON COUNTY, KANSAS – April 7) The COVID-19 vaccine has been available to Johnson County residents for a few months now. The first step for those who live or work in Johnson County who are interested in receiving the COVID-19 vaccination from the Johnson County Department of Health and Environment (JCDHE) is to complete the county's vaccine interest survey.
